One such zealous activity supported at the institute is Rovers. Rover is a group of enthusiastic and dedicated students who devote their energies for the cause of the society. After the grand success of Rover's crew, we are happy to announce the formation of a unit for our girls scout namely "Rangers" under the banner of Bharat scout and guide. The purpose is to inspire and teach them basic survival skills. Their commendable activities have been noticed and felicitated by the government as well.

The Bharat Scout and Guide is a voluntary, non-political, educational movement for young people open to all without distinction of origin, race or creed in accordance with the purpose, principle and methods conceived by the founder Lord Baden Powell in 1907.

The purpose of the movement is to contribute to the development of young people in achieving their complete physical, intellectual, emotional, social and spiritual potentials as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of local, national and international communities.
