The Battle of Chamkaur Sahib


Chidiyanaal main baajladawa, Giddrantoh main sherbanawa Sawa lakh se ekladawa, Tab Gobind Singh naamdharawa

The city of Anandpur Sahib was founded by Guru Tegh Bahadur, the ninth Sikh Guru and it prospered and flourished under the leadership of the tenth Guru, Guru Gobind Singh. He established the Khalsa Panth there in 1699. Emperor Aurangzeb feared that the meteorical rise of the Khalsa would threaten his supremacy and ordered his Governor Wazir Khan to destroy Anandpur Sahib. The Hindu Rajas and the Muslims sided with Wazir khan and cut off supplies to the city leading to starvation. Aurangzeb sent a message to the Guru, assuring him of a safe passage if he left the city. The guru realised it was a trap but he had no choice. They were ambushed by the Mughals and in the course of the battle, two of his sons (Sahebzade) accompanied him and remaining two got separated and went with Mata Gujri Devi, the Guru's mother. The Guru and 40 of his followers took shelter in a fort at Chamkaur Sahib and resolved to fight till the last drop of blood. They were hopelessly outnumbered by the Mughals who were 10 lakhs in number. At that point of time, Guru Gobind Singh uttered the above words...one sikh is equal to 1.25 lakh Mughals. His sons fought valiantly but were martyred. Guruji was forced to escape with five of his followers.

Meanwhile, a former servant of Guruji's household gave shelter to Mata Gujri and two younger Sahebzade but later on disclosed their location to Wazir Khan who offered to save their lives if they converted to Islam. When the boys who were only seven and nine years old refused, the Governor ordered them to be bricked alive. Their grandmother passed away on hearing this tragic news. Gurudwara Fatehgarh Sahib stands at the spot of the martyrdom.

There is no parallel to the martyrdom of such young boys in the annals of human history. On hearing this news, Guru Gobind Singh wrote a beautiful letter Zafarnama to Aurangzeb-"It matters little if a jackal through cunningness and treachery succeeds in killing two lion cubs; for the lion himself lives to inflict retribution on you".

Such is the glory of the Sikh faith!

Legacy of Chattrapati Shivaji

Very few of us know that there is a statue of Chattrapati Shivaji Maharaj in Vietnam. He is worshipped as a great warrior in a country which is thousands of miles away from India. When the Vietnamese President Ho Chi Minh was asked about the reason for this respect, he said that, "It was impossible for Vietnam to defeat the superpower America in a long drawn war (1954-1975) but during the war I read the biography of a brave king from India -Shivaji. We adopted his guerrilla warfare which he had used against the Mughals and achieved victory. Had this great king been born in our country, we would have ruled the world!".

President Ho Chi Minh had a great regard for Shivaji Maharaj so much so that he had instructed his officers to write on his (President) tombstone, "Amaval (soldier) of Shivaji Maharaj is laid to rest here". That sentence can be seen even today.

Years later, Vietnamese Foreign Minister visited India and was taken to see the Red Fort and the Samadhi of Mahatma Gandhi. The Indian officers accompanying her were surprised when she insisted on visiting the Samadhi of Shivaji Maharaj. She was taken to Raigad in Maharashtra where she first paid respect and then collected

the soil and put it in her purse with a lot of devotion. When the press asked her about this, she said, "This is the soil of great warriors. A great king like Chattrapati was born here. After going back I will mix this soil with the soil of Vietnam so that great valiant leaders will be born even in my country".

Such is the legacy of Chattrapati Shivaji...
