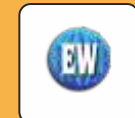

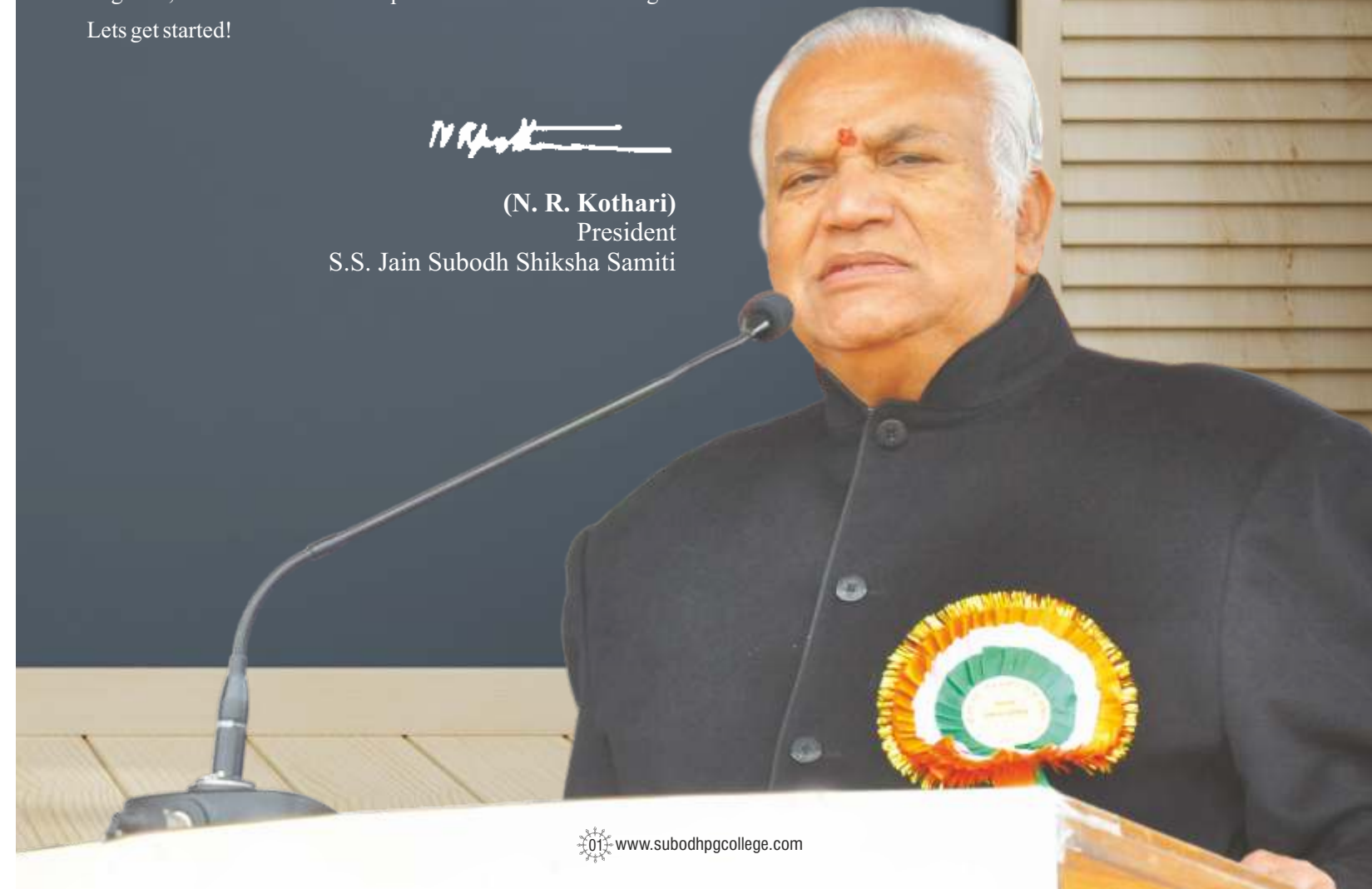

High Technology Audio Visual Auditoriums

Two centrally air-conditioned auditoriums with hi-tech audio and video facility, each seating 350 people.

Conference Hall

Air-conditioned conference hall with a 60-seat capacity, featuring modern amenities.

Seminar Halls

Two seminar halls with a combined seating capacity of 300, equipped with advanced audio-visual facilities and LCD projectors.

Lecture Theatre

lecture theatre with a seating capacity of 175, equipped with modern ICT teaching aids.

Smart Class Rooms

Ten smart classrooms equipped with ICT-based learning tools, including computers, projectors, internet, and multimedia devices.

Students participate in the "Earn While Learn" program to gain hands-on experience and certification.

Well-equipped medical room providing first aid and emergency care for students, faculty, and staff.

Boys & Girls Hostel

Wi-Fi-enabled hostels for outstation students. The girls' hostel, located on the outskirts of Jaipur, accommodates 225 students with 24/7 security.

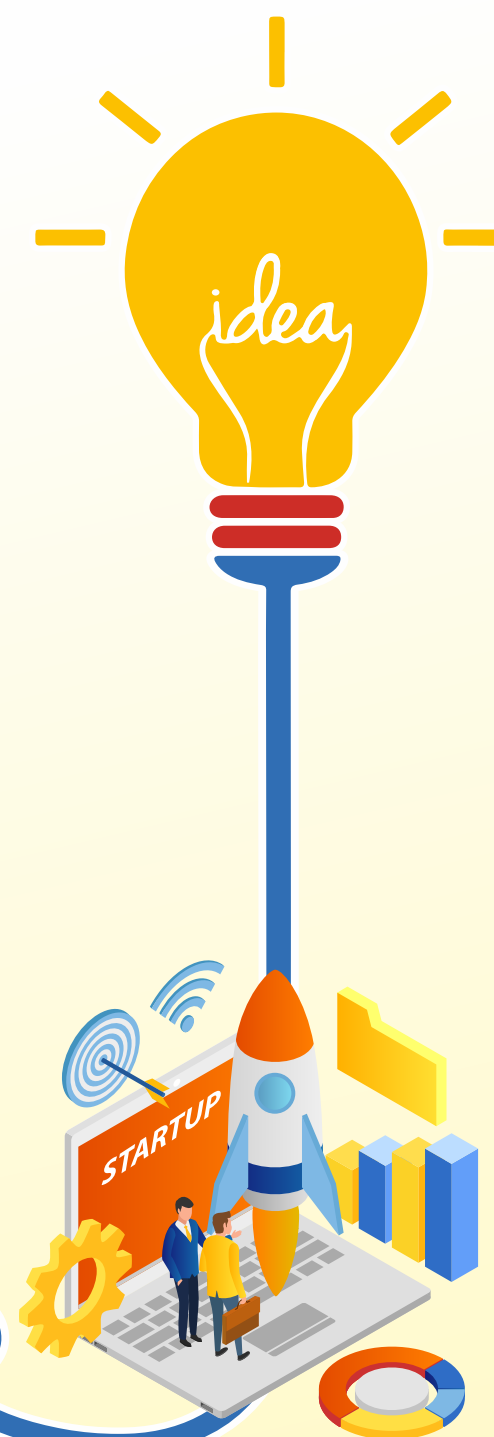

It offers dedicated workspace, mentoring support, technical assistance, and incubation guidance for students who aspire to build scalable ventures.

The major strength of the cell is its advanced innovation laboratory, equipped with scientific and experimental apparatus that encourage research and prototype development. Important key facilities include Joe Cell for Hydrogen Production, Probe Sonicator for Nanoparticle Synthesis, Membrane Fabrication Unit, Newton's Cradle, Lorentz Oscillator, Lissajous Apparatus, Rotational Dynamics Setup, Inclined Motion Models, and Air Cannon. These facilities enable students to experiment, design, test, and innovate beyond traditional learning methods.

Students are provided structured support in idea validation, business model creation, market research, branding, pitching, financial planning, and commercialization strategies. Regular workshops, startup bootcamps, seminars, expert talks, internship programs, and innovation competitions are organized to expose students to emerging industry trends and entrepreneurial opportunities.

The college also encourages participation in iStart Rajasthan, the flagship startup initiative of the Government of Rajasthan. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- Admissions in various courses are done strictly on the basis of merit in qualifying exam.
- Following Weightage in admission are given to students:
 - Jain candidate: 3%
 - Female candidates: 3%
 - SC & ST candidates: 3%
 - OBC (non-creamy layer), SBC, MBC, EWS candidates: 1%
 - NCC / NSS / Rovers / Sports candidates: Additional weightage as per the guidelines of the State Government
- Out of the above weightage for admission, only one and highest weightage will be considerable.
- A weightage of 5% is given to candidates graduated with Honours course for admission in any post-graduate course.
- Undergraduate students (Subodhians) aspiring to seek admission in Post Graduate courses shall be admitted only when the college Principal is satisfied with his/her character and conduct
- In case a student has a gap of more than two regular academic sessions in a regular course, then he/she shall not be allowed admission in the next class.
- If a student has passed PG Previous as a Private or Non-Collegiate candidate, he / she will not be given admission in final year as a regular student.

- Fee deposited after due date will not be valid and is sufficient cause for denial of admission.

It is mandatory for all the students to deposit their fees on time and if he/she fails to do so, then his/her registration in the college will be cancelled.

SELECTION PROCESS

- Names of candidates selected for admission in various courses will be displayed on the notice board / website of the college. There will be no telephonic or postal information.
- After admission in a stream, change to other stream shall be allowed only, when the marks obtained by the candidate in the qualifying examination (10+2) are higher than that of the students last admitted in the stream / class and also subject to the condition that there is a vacant seat in the class/stream.
